We are busily preparing for the all breed show from June 30-July2 and need help with the raffle. Ring practices are starting. We all need the opportunity to prepare for the June show.



AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.



Nosework Seminar Part 2 - contributed by Cathy Wright

A little more than a year ago LCKC had its first Nosework Seminar with Karyn Eby. About ten club members participated then, and a core group of us continued to learn the skills necessary to participate in the various venues of scent working with dogs.

This last weekend, a year later, that core Nosework group plus some new teams attended a Next-Step Seminar with Karyn again, and We Had Fun, and Did GREAT!

The dynamics of working with your dog in Scent Work is hard to show with still photography, but here are a bunch of photos of us this weekend.

A little background...

Nosework is basically a fun adaptation of the more serious uses of dogs' incredible sense of smell. Using the same techniques that bomb detection, search and rescue, and drug sniffing dogs are trained in, Scent Work dogs are trained to find specific odors – Birch, Anise, and Clove in four ways – on vehicles, in a room, outside, and in containers.

It is really a great dog/handler team activity in which ALL dogs, even old, disabled, and reactive dogs can participate.

We are hoping to be approved for AKC Scent Work Events, and possibly other organized Scent Work activities soon.

Thanks so much to Deb St Myers, specifically for setting up the seminar and doing everything to make it happen... including chauffeuring, housing, feeding Karyn!


